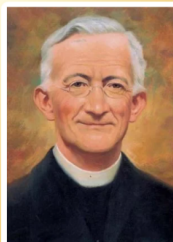

On August 08, the English and Culture Studies Program held a certificate ceremony and end-of-semester social to honor and say goodbye to the program's graduates. The graduates included:

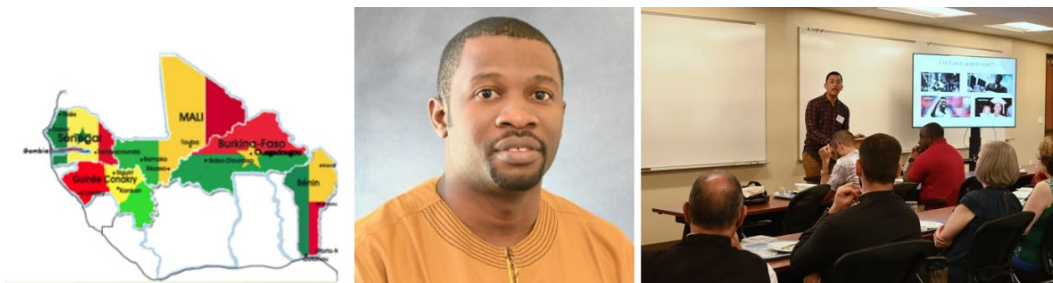

English & Culture Studies Field Trips

ECS students visited New Glarus on July 10, visiting the Swiss Historical Village for a guided tour, which showed students the Swiss immigrant settlement of New Glarus (circa. 1845), and traces the Swiss colony's growth into a dairy farming community. The complex includes 14 buildings, some replicas, and some original buildings (eg, Settler's Cabin, Smoke House, Collectibles building - an old rural schoolhouse). ECS students also visited the New Glarus Brewery for a tour and tasting of some of Wisconsin's most famous beer. Additionally, on July 17, ECS students visited the Milwaukee Art Museum and were given a guided tour before a relaxing lunch by Lake Michigan. Following the museum, the students were taken to the Basilica of Saint Josaphat where they received another tour of the beautiful architecture and learned about the rich history of the building. Their third field trip took place on July 31, where ECS students took a trip to Chicago where they enjoyed a guided tour of a Gilded Age mansion called the Driehaus Museum. The students also visited Holy Name Cathedral and took a walking tour of sites including the Chicago River and Magnificent Mile. In the afternoon, they had a private meeting with Cardinal Cupich, where each student shared information about him or herself, and the Cardinal answered questions from the group.
