

The day was filled with meaningful prayer, quiet reflection, and community time.





Bösendorfer Piano Donation

Sacred Heart Seminary and School of Theology received a truly remarkable gift, a 1964 Bösendorfer Model 275 9' concert grand piano for Sacred Heart Chapel.

The piano comes to Sacred Heart from Augustine Academy, who acquired the piano when they purchased the campus of the former Cardinal Stritch University. The Academy did not have the space or use for the instrument and was glad to donate it to Sacred Heart so it will continue to be used for beautiful music and the glory of God.

Bösendorfer has been making pianos in Vienna, Austria, since 1828, and are the oldest continually operating high-end piano maker in the world. Their instruments are made by hand with exquisite attention to detail—only 200-300 are produced each year—and are prized for their beauty of tone and exceptional quality. Bösendorfer pioneered expanding the range of the piano, and their large concert pianos, such as the model 275, are famous for including extra bass keys. The extra notes not only provide a greater compass but also add resonance to the piano through sympathetic vibrations and a larger soundboard. While a standard piano has 88 keys, A0-C8, the Bösendorfer 275 adds four keys for a total of 92, from F0-C8.



Annual Retreat for Deacons and Wives

Deacon Steve Kramer gave the Annual Retreat for Deacons and Wives for the Diocese of Belleville, Illinois this past weekend (September 6-8, 2024). It was held at the Shrine of Our Lady of the Snows in Belleville. There were 42 participants. The focus of the retreat was, "The Word of God Leads Us to Eucharist" which tied in the experience of many of the Belleville deacons at the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis in July 2024. Deacon Steve gave five one-hour + presentations during the retreat. Shown in the picture above is Ms. Patti Warner (recently retired associate director of Deacon Formation), Deacon Steve, and Fr. Steve Pautler a 2018 graduate of SHSST. Fr. Steve is pastor

of two parishes as well as director of Deacon Formation for the Belleville diocese.
