

Celebrating the 150th Anniversary of Milwaukee's Elevation to an Archdiocese February 12, 2025, marked the 150th anniversary of Milwaukee's elevation to an archdiocese. This anniversary was commemorated at Sacred Heart on February 11 with a book signing and lecture by one of the Archdiocese's foremost historians and former SHSST adjunct professor, Fr. Steven Avella. The evening began with Solemn Prayer in the Sacred Heart Chapel where Most Rev. James T. Schuerman, Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, presided. After evening prayer attendees from throughout the Archdiocese joined the Sacred Heart faculty and seminarians for a reception before Fr. Avella's lecture. Fr. Avella's lecture marked not only the Archdiocese's anniversary but also the release of his new book, Three More Archbishops of Milwaukee. Fr. Avella's lecture as well as his book explore three important bishops of Milwaukee from 1930 to 1958. Fr. Avella explored the impact these bishops had on the Catholic community and most importantly the ways in which their shared theological visions were emblematic of their educations in Rome. Fr. Avella closed the Q&A portion of the evening, following his lecture, by urging seminarians from all dioceses and religious communities to engage with their shared Catholic history saying, "Enter into your heritage".



Bridging Communities Over Bagels


